

## EXHIBIT A

**618.01 (b)** No person who is the owner, keeper, or harbinger of any animal, including a dog, **or chicken** shall permit it to run at large upon any public property, including, without limitation, sidewalks and streets, or upon the premises of another without the permission of the owner of said premises.

**(d)** No person who is the owner, keeper, or harbinger of any dog **or chicken** shall fail at any time to keep it either physically confined or restrained upon the premises of the owner, keeper or harbinger by a leash, tether, adequate fence, supervision, or secure enclosure to prevent escape, or under reasonable control of a person of such age, size and discretion that the is capable of preventing the dog from approaching any person or other animal in a menacing fashion.

**1260.35** “Agriculture” means the use of land for farming, dairying, pasturage, apiculture, horticulture, floriculture, viticulture and animal and poultry husbandry, **excluding not more than ten(10) chickens on property over one acre and (5) chickens on property under one acre which are specifically permitted and regulated in residentially zoned districts**, and the necessary accessory uses or packing, treating or storing the produce, provided, however, that:

- A. The operation of any such accessory use shall be secondary to that of normal agricultural activities.
- B. The above uses shall not include the feeding or sheltering of animals or poultry in penned enclosures within 100 feet of any residential zoning district. Agriculture does not include the feeding of garbage to animals or the operation or maintenance of a commercial stockyard or feedyard.

**1270.02 (a): Permitted uses.**

(3) Except as prohibited by homeowners associations, one hen chicken coop and outdoor enclosure which shall require the prior issuance of a zoning certificate to the title owner of the subject real estate in accordance with the provisions of Sections 1262.03, 1262.04 and 1262.05 and 1262.06 of the Planning and Zoning Code of the City of Columbiana, and which must meet the following conditions and restrictions:

- A. Such coop and enclosure shall not exceed forty-five (45) square feet in area, four (4) feet in height, and shall be situated only in a rear yard of a residential lot not less than one hundred (100) feet from any dwelling or occupied structure other than the owner's dwelling.
- B. Such coop and enclosure shall be constructed with predator-proof materials (wood or metal), well ventilated, and designed to be easily accessed for cleaning.
- C. Such coop and enclosure shall house not more than ten (10) hens on property over one acre and (5) hens on property under one acre, no roosters, and such hens shall not leave such coop and enclosure at any time.
- D. No hen shall be slaughtered within such coop or enclosure, or anywhere upon the owner's premises, other than within the owner's dwelling.
- E. Such coop and enclosure and such hens shall not be owned, possessed, held or maintained for any commercial purpose.
- F. Such coop and enclosure shall be kept in a sanitary condition, free of offensive odors and the accumulation of waste. Chicken waste shall be stored in a fly tight, leak proof container, and disposed of not less often than weekly in a lawful manner which may include the composting of the same in a garden bed so long as such composting is odor free.
- G. All chicken feed shall be stored in a rodent-proof container.
- H. No person shall own, harbor, possess, hold or maintain chickens which disturb the peace by making noise which causes inconveniences, annoyances or alarm to another.

**1272.02(a) Permitted uses.**
